The office has a meeting space that doubles as an informal classroom, a computer lab with eleven public access computers and a quiet study space, wireless access, a printer/photocopier and a lounge space open to all members of the GSLIS West community.

Access to the office is available 24/7, by combination lock. To obtain the code to the lock, contact Terry Plum, Raynna Bowlby, Johanna Radding, or any LISSA West officer.

There is a small kitchen, with a microwave, refrigerator, and eating supplies that are available to all students. If you use the kitchen, please clean up any trash. Note that the office does not have janitorial services, so please clean up as you leave and throw away all rubbish. Use either the small receptacles in the office or the large one *outside* of the office. If there is a large amount of garbage, take it to the dumpsters in the basement.

Student meetings and workshops are often scheduled in the GSLIS West Office on Saturdays between or after classes.

Communication

The primary means of communication among GSLIS West students and faculty are through the web-based courseware eLearning, listservs, and email. You are responsible for checking both eLearning and your Simmons email account frequently. (To sign up for the GSLIS West listserv, login here:

Every student enrolled in the GSLIS program is given an email account. Email addresses usually follow the format of firstname.lastname@simmons.edu. Login names and passwords are sent to you before classes begin. If you lose your username or password, please contact the Tech Lab at 617.521.2802 or email at gslislab@simmons.edu.

All official GSLIS information will be sent out through your Simmons email account. You will be responsible for all information sent out through your account. Please check your Simmons account regularly or forward it to your personal email account

Computers in the GSLIS West Office

There are eleven iMac workstations plus wireless access available in the GSLIS West Office. Most of these computers run both Mac OS X and Vista. These computers are available 24x7. Any software specific to GSLIS West (for example, Oxygen or NotePad) is installed on these workstations. Printing, photocopying and scanning are free from the office. The photocopier will make pdfs of scanned materials, and emails the pdf to your email address. Consider using this function rather than printing to save paper. Contact Johanna Radding to have your email address added to the GSLIS West printer.

Computers in the Mount Holyoke College (MHC) Library

The MHC Library has an Information Commons with over 30 workstations, both PC and Mac, and there are 20 workstations in the Reference Room. These computers have both Internet and library database access. Please use Simmons GSLIS online databases and e-journals through the Simmons proxy server from the Simmons GSLIS Library web page, rather than the MHC databases. The Library also has wireless access for laptops. The Library charges for printing.

Course Selection

The mission of GSLIS West is to provide a selection of the most popular courses offered by GSLIS to support a generalist GSLIS degree; GSLIS West offers roughly 25 - 30 courses per year. GSLIS West supports most of the courses in the Archives Management concentration and most of the courses in the School Library Teacher Program. However, no matter what your program or specialty, it is likely you will need to take courses at GSLIS Boston to complete your degree. GSLIS West does not attempt to offer every course in the GSLIS program.

eLearning

Simmons GSLIS uses eLearning for its web-based courseware, <http://my.simmons.edu/elearning/> or Moodle, <http://gslis.simmons.edu/moodle> (both require login). Its primary uses are information delivery and communication. Check the eLearning or Moodle site to access the courses in which you have enrolled and the LISSA West site.

Honor Code and Community Code

Identification (ID) Cards

Tuition must be paid in full before a GSLIS West student Mount Holyoke College photo ID card can be issued. The ID card functions as a library card for all students, faculty, and staff. As a new student, you are expected to obtain a photo All-Campus ID card from the Mount Holyoke College Card Services Office on Advising Day or during the first week of classes. A second ID card without a photograph for Simmons GSLIS in Boston will be provided, but anyone taking classes at both campuses should obtain a Simmons College photo ID card at the Boston campus. For GSLIS West students, the Simmons GSLIS card for Boston is helpful if you go to Boston and need to park in the College lot, use the Library, etc. If you are coming from Boston to take a class at GSLIS West, you should obtain a GSLIS West student photo ID card in order to use the MHC Library.

The Card Services Office is located in back of the Central Services Building facing Lower Lake and is responsible for managing all functions of the All-campus ID OneCard program. Photographs for new ID cards or replacements are taken there. Deposits can be made to the debit account affiliated with the card (MHCXPress), questions answered, and problems resolved. Typically, twenty dollars is placed on your card by GSLIS at the beginning of the Fall and Spring semesters for snacks or other uses. There is an automated deposit machine for MHCXpress accounts across from the circulation desk in the Library; you can add money to your account at any time using that machine.

Lost or stolen cards should be reported immediately to the Card Services Office during business hours or to the Office of Public Safety when Card Services is closed. The card will be disabled to prevent unauthorized use. A \$15 replacement fee is charged if a new card must be printed. The Card Services Office is open Monday through Friday, 9:00 am to 5:00 pm. Please note that the office is not open on Saturday, so the easiest time to get an ID card is during the Student Advising Day, which is scheduled for January 28, 2010.

Library Privileges – Borrowing

As a student enrolled in the GSLIS West Program, you are entitled to borrowing privileges and other services at both the Simmons College and Mount Holyoke College Libraries. The Simmons College Library also supports GSLIS West Course Reserves and students' Document Delivery/Inter-library Loan needs.

The Simmons College Libraries serve the academic, research, information, study, and some recreational needs of Simmons students, faculty, and staff. It is wise to check the current hours before traveling to Boston to use the Libraries.

The Mount Holyoke College Libraries are part of the MHC Library, Information, and Technology Services organization (LITS), which supports the varied information and electronic technology needs of students, faculty, and staff. Housed in the Williston-Miles-Smith-Dwight complex, LITS offers a variety of services across the College campus. See <http://www.mtholyoke.edu/lits/> for a fuller description of LITS services. As a student enrolled in the GSLIS West Program you are not eligible for interlibrary loan library privileges in the Five College System. However, Massachusetts residents are eligible to borrow materials from the libraries of the University of Massachusetts at Amherst.

LISSA

As a student enrolled in GSLIS you are automatically a member of LISSA, the Library and Information Sciences Student Association. LISSA supports the interests and welfare of students in the GSLIS program. It sponsors lectures and social events, provides financial support for students to attend conferences, and otherwise seeks to support students' interests, both academically and socially.

LISSA West meets several times per semester—typically between classes on Saturdays. Lunch is usually provided. Occasionally LISSA events occur after classes on Saturdays. You are encouraged to attend these meetings. In addition, interested students have the opportunity to run for election as a LISSA officer.

LISSA West maintains an eLearning space where you can find updated news and information about the program. The site also includes a directory of students and faculty, a calendar of events, a bulletin board forum, and course syllabi and evaluations. Mount Holyoke College Residential, Sports, and other Campus Life Facilities

GSLIS West students are not eligible to participate in activities or use facilities intended for Mount Holyoke College undergraduates, such as residence halls and dining rooms, health services, student government, mail services, and sports centers.

Parking

On weekends, you can park in Faculty/Staff parking areas on the Mount Holyoke College campus. The map found at <http://www.mtholyoke.edu/cic/map/> identifies the Faculty/Staff parking areas.

The GSLIS West Office is located in the Village Commons. As a student of GSLIS West, you may also park in the Village Commons parking lot free of charge. Overnight parking is not allowed without permission of the Village Commons management. Please park in the second tier of parking places, away from the buildings, so that the retail customers have access to the stores.

Handicapped parking is available behind the Library and next to Shattuck Hall.

Safety

Mount Holyoke College's Department of Public Safety, located in the Central Services Complex, has trained operators on duty 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, and may be phoned for help in an emergency at 1-911 (from campus phones) or 413.538.2304 (from non-campus phones). A campus ride service is available when the College is in session, which provides safe transportation to students traveling within the campus, including the Village Commons, during evening hours. You must fill out the form and follow the policy.

Your professor will need a directive from Academic Support in order to provide reasonable accommodations.

Weather (Inclement)

For snow or inclement weather closings, GSLIS West first follows the directives of Mount Holyoke College. The emergency number at Mount Holyoke College is 413.538.2330. However, on Saturdays when most of our courses are held, we make an independent decision about closing. For inclement weather announcements for GSLIS West, please call the office at 413.533.2400. Announcements will

be placed on the voice mail greeting. Notification will also be made through email using the gslisatmhc-l list, a listserv to which all GSLIS West faculty members and students are added.

Withdrawal from School or Courses

You may withdraw from a course without academic penalty at any time prior to its last scheduled meeting. If you find it necessary to withdraw or take a leave of absence from GSLIS during the regular academic year or the summer session, you must send written notification indicating the reason for the withdrawal to the Director of Admissions. All add/drops can be made via AARC

(<https://aarc.simmons.edu>) through the end date and time listed under "My Registration Priority"; for changes after the posted dates but prior to the second class, contact the Registrar's Office at 617-521-2111. If you have any questions, call the AARC hotline at (617) 521-2102 or e-mail aarcsupport@simmons.edu.

Registration is binding, both financially and academically. Financial aid recipients should consult with a Financial Aid Officer at the Main Campus in Boston before withdrawing from a course or courses, or from the program, since dropping or withdrawing from a course may have financial aid implications.

Your Personal Needs – Food Services

The *Blanchard Café* and the *Uncommon Ground Coffee Bar* are found in the Blanchard Campus Center. *Rao's* has a coffee shop in the MHC Library lobby.

Food service establishments in the Village Commons offer a variety of reasonably priced eat-in/take-out options, including Chinese, Mexican, and American style cuisines, snacks, and full-service menus, as well as the *Tailgate Picnic*, a combined convenience store/delicatessen with tables that offers breakfast, lunch, and light supper fare. *The Thirsty Mind*, located near the Administrative Office is an upscale coffee-house and bookstore serving bagels, muffins, and other snacks.

Other moderately-priced options include *The Yarde House*, located near the post office next to the Village Commons. *Johnny's Bar and Grill* in the Village Commons, and *El Guanaco*, a very affordable Mexican/Salvadorian restaurant located on Route 116 in South Hadley Falls about 7 minutes from campus.

Nearby Northampton is also known for its varied, upscale dining.
