### Job Requirements

- Licensed Masters Level Social Worker (LCSW) or Mental Health Counselor (LMHC) in Massachusetts.
- Extensive experience with wraparound, home-based and outpatient clinical services.
- At least 2 years experience in direct practice that involves knowledge of mental illnesses and treatment methods, psychopharmacology and practices used in psychiatric disorders.
- Experience collaborating with state agencies (DCF, DMH, DPH, and DYS).
- Ability to negotiate, problem solve, handle multiple tasks simultaneously and meet deadlines.
- Experience doing outreach, case management, and facilitating groups.
- Ability to be part of a multidisciplinary team.
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills in the English language.
- Sensitive to LGBT issues.
- Computer/Microsoft Office skills.
- Valid driver license and access to an automobile

### Job Responsibilities:

- Provide outpatient and home-based family stabilization services.
- Offer individual, family, and group therapy in a strength-based, client-centered framework.
- Facilitate psycho-educational, prevention, and/or therapeutic support groups focused on contemporary social problems and mental health issues.
- Complete all documentation required for each client (intakes, progress notes, CM, billing, ETO)
- Collect monthly statistics and complete reporting for programs assigned.
- On call availability (some evenings and weekends) for intense services (FST, CBHI, outpatient)
- Complete tasks assigned by Clinical Director and Program Supervisor

- Bilingual (Spanish/English and/or Cape Verdean Creole/English).
- Experience working with Latino families, preferably in a community setting.
