⁵ Evaluation in SW Practice (SW 509) is offered in the fall and spring semesters and must be taken concurrently with Field Education II (SW 447A or B). Urban Leadership students should register for SW 509 in the fall.

⁶ Students must stay in the same section (day, time, and professor) of Practice (SW 421 and SW 424) for both fall and spring semesters.

Students should consult with the ASK Advisor if they deviate from the above plan.

Students in specializations must complete the elective requirements to graduate with a specialization.
