## **Notes**

- Major requires 44 semester hours, plus 4 hours of capstone.
- Two of the eleven required courses must be 300-level literature seminars.
- \*ENGL 307 may satisfy the literature from 1610-1800 requirement OR the 19<sup>th</sup>-c. English literature requirement, not both
- \*\*ENGL 211/311 and 254 may satisfy the 19<sup>th</sup>-c. English literature requirement OR the British/U.S. Literature and/or Media of the 20<sup>th</sup> and/or 21<sup>st</sup>century requirement, not both.
- \*\*\*ENGL 178, 239, 275, and 317 may satisfy the Multi-Ethnic Literature OR the British/U.S. Literature and/or Media of the 20<sup>th</sup> and/or 21<sup>st</sup>century requirement, not both.
- ENGL 323 Special Topics, in its various versions, may satisfy one of these requirements; consult with department chair

## **English Major Core**

Majors will complete a core of the following courses. ENGL 199 is an introduction to the major and is open to all students thinking about majoring in English. All potential majors are urged to take it no later than the beginning of their sophomore year. While ENGL 199 and 200 constitute a sequence and must be taken in that order, this sequence is not necessarily consecutive. ENGL 199 is a class appropriate for incoming first-year students, while ENGL 200 is an advanced course in critical theory, open only to students with sophomore standing and above who have taken ENGL 199. ENGL 199 is the prerequisite to all 300-level literature classes offered by this department.
