

In-Class Workshop Guide

The CEC partners with faculty to help students develop professional skills and knowledge for making informed career decisions. We work closely with faculty members to present in-class career-related workshops that integrate coursework with professional preparation. In evaluations, students rate the effectiveness of these workshops highly, with an average rating of 4.65 on a 5 point scale.

Workshop and Presentation Topics

Faculty invite the CEC into the classroom for workshops that typically run the length of one class session. You can select topics from a full complement of skill-building, career exploration, and other programs that span the full five steps in the career development model [link to new 5 Step Career Development Model page]. CEC staff will also work with you to customize any presentation on career topics and resources for particular disciplines, programs and/or departments. Past topics for workshops and presentations include:

- Utilizing LinkedIn, social media, and other resources for career development
- Networking and informational interviewing
- Implementing a search for an internship, job, or graduate school
- Writing resumes or cover letters
- Preparing for an interview or negotiation process
