SUMMER 2019 GRADUATE STUDIES NON-DEGREE REGISTRATION

Non-Degree Policies

Enrollment in certain non-degree courses may require the consent of the program director. Nondegree students may enroll in up to eight credits (typically two graduate courses) before being formally admitted to a degree program. If you take the courses in separate semesters, you must earn a grade of B (3.0) or better to enroll in the second course.

Semester Dates

The official Summer semester runs from May 20 to August 20; however, there are several start dates throughout the semester. In addition, courses are offered in varied formats throughout the term. Certain disciplines and courses may begin before the formal start of the semester and end after the formal end date. For specific course details including course titles and up-to-date meeting times, check the attached listing or courses.simmons.edu/summer for full course descriptions.

Applying to a Degree Program

Non-degree students may enroll in up to two graduate courses before being formally admitted to a degree program. If you are planning to apply to a degree program, verify with your program director that the course you choose will apply towards your intended degree. Non-degree students must earn a grade of B (3.0) or better in each course to be considered for admission to a degree program. However, successful completion of non-degree classes does not guarantee acceptance into a program.

Registration Procedure

Choose your class from the attached non-degree courses schedule and return the attached registration form to the Office of Graduate Studies Admission. 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Tuition General Refund Policy

If you should completely withdraw from all coursework after classes begin, you may still be accountable for a portion of tuition and other fees. Tuition Payments

Once registered, you will receive a bill from Student Accounts.
