

**Notes**

- Students who received an academic accommodation of a language alternate through the Office of Accessibility Services are required to complete **two** alternate courses relating to global issues and cultural understanding.
- In consultation with their Academic Advisors, they should select **two additional** courses (at least 8 semester hours), which fulfill the Global Cultural (GC) Key Content Areas requirement and which have an international perspective.
- Therefore, these students will complete a total of three GC courses for graduation. They should note whether the selected courses have pre-requisites and plan accordingly. The same rules governing the Language Requirement govern this option: the courses cannot be taken Pass/Fail.
