## AFROTC/ROTC @ SIMMONS

Simmons has maintained a good relationship with the cadres of Liberty Battalion at NEU and the 355 Detachment at BU for over two decades. Simmons students have successfully commissioned from these programs, and these students have gone on to have careers and graduate training in the armed forces.

Students completing AFROTC training are allowed the following academic privileges:

- Transfer of 28crs completed with the Department of Aerospace Studies at Boston University.
- Use of courses as PLAN equivalents:
  - AF310: Leadership Course fulfillment
  - AF320: Leadership Course fulfillment
  - AF410: SH KCA fulfillment

\*Completion of AF310/20 occurs in the third year of training. Students need to complete a Leadership course as per PLAN requirements, and so failure to complete the above courses would result in the need to complete a Simmons course

Students completing ROTC training are allowed the following academic privileges:

- Transfer of 28crs completed with the Department of Military Science at North Eastern University.
- Use of courses as PLAN equivalents:
  - MS/ARMY 301 - Training Management and War-fighting functions (2crs)
  - MS/ARMY 302 - Applied Leadership in Small Unit Operations : Leadership Course Fulfillment (2crs)
  - ARMY3503 - American Military History: SH KCA fulfillment

- ARMY3513 - AMH lab (0crs - taken with ARMY3503)

\*Completion of MS301/302 occurs in the third year of training. Students need to complete a Leadership course as per PLAN requirements, and so failure to complete the above courses would result in the need to complete a Simmons course

### **“Army Nurse Corps ROTC Program**

ROTC provides an opportunity for college nursing students to receive practical, hands-on leadership experience. The courses provide a chance for students to develop management, communication, and decision-making skills. ROTC also provides nursing cadets an opportunity to participate in the Nurse Summer Training Program (NSTP). NSTP is a paid, three-to-four-week, hands-on clinical elective for Army ROTC nurse cadets. This elective is conducted at more than twenty Army hospitals in the continental United States, Hawaii, and Germany. During the NSTP clinical elective, the cadet receives experience under the direct supervision of a preceptor—an Army Nurse Corps officer who works with the cadet one-on-one. Scholarship nurse cadets receive a monthly cash stipend while in school as well as full tuition and fees and \$1,200 per year for books.” - taken from the website.

NSTP is performed in one of the 22 US military hospitals around the world. This training is performed AFTER graduation, and so is not eligible for use as a preceptor alternative.
