

Curriculum Notes

- Students are required to complete 72 credit hours for the major.
- Additional suggested coursework:
 - ACCT220: Accounting and Business Applications in Excel (2 credits; Fall)
 - ECON101: Macroeconomics (4 credits)
- GPA Calculation
 - Most potential employers will calculate your Overall GPA as well as your Accounting GPA (ACCT GPA) for internships and full-time employment. Also, membership in BAPsi requires a 3.2 GPA.
 - \circ ~ AP credits are NOT computed into your GPA.
 - o "W" grades do not count in your GPA.

CPA Information

- Requirements to sit for the CPA exam vary by state. In Massachusetts, you may apply to sit for the exam if
 you are at least 18 years of age, be within 90 days of earning a Bachelor's degree, be completing a degree
 consisting of at least 120 hours from an accredited university, have completed 21 hours undergraduate
 accounting courses (see coursework minimum below), and have completed 9 hours of business courses.
- Updated information regarding the CPA exam requirements by state is available at https://cpacentral.nasba.org/.
- The schedule below is designed to prepare you to take the CPA exam in the summer after you graduate with your undergraduate degree. Most firms offer starting contracts for September or October after you graduate with the hope that you will pass one or more of the four parts of the CPA exam.
- Graduates need 144 credits to get hired by the larger accounting firms. This is also the requirement to be licensed as a CPA. This can be accomplished by taking 18 credits each semester and the 6 credit CPA review course offered as graduate credit the summer after graduation.
