Simmons University is grateful to partner with the Boston Area Rape Crisis Center (BARCC) to provide various crisis services and resources to the Simmons community. Through BARCC, Simmons can offer our students, faculty, and staff crisis intervention, counseling, and advocacy.

What services are available to me through BARCC?

- A 24-hour hotline (800-841-8371) (Individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing: <u>Mass Relay</u>)
- Webchat (7 days/week, 9am-11pm)
- Counseling
- Medical accompaniment
- Legal advocacy

Are these services confidential?

Yes! Except in certain instances involving the health and safety of the individual or others, BARCC's services are confidential.

Are these services free?

Yes! BARCC's services are free.

These may include cases involving abuse of minors, persons with disabilities, or the elderly; when required to provide testimony in response to a subpoena or court order; or where an individual is at risk of imminent harm to self or others.

PEER SUPPORTERS AT SIMMONS: BETSY'S FRIENDS

Betsy's Friends is a unique peer education program designed to educate students about relationship violence through weekly meetings and peer supports. Peer Supporters are trained undergraduate students that can be accessed by attending weekly office hours. Students may discuss relationships, being a survivor, how to help a friend, and navigating resources on campus. Because they have the responsibility to report to the Title IX team, they cannot be considered fully 'confidential'.
