University Policy on Commencement Regalia and Adornments (Cords and Stoles)

I. Policy Scope

This policy aims to set standards related to student academic regalia and student adornments worn at Simmons commencement ceremonies and to clarify in which cases the University will purchase cords and stoles. The policy applies to baccalaureate, masters, and doctoral graduates of Simmons University.

II. Purpose of the Policy

The purpose of this policy is to ensure compliance with acceptable regalia and student adornments and to clarify confusion among graduating students about what is allowed. The policy outlines the acceptable cords and regalia that students may receive/ purchase and wear to Simmons Commencement. Additionally, the policy indicates which cords and stoles are purchased by the student and which are purchased by the university.

III. Definitions

Define terms that have specialized or particular meanings in the policy.

- **Cord**- Twisted colored strings with tassels worn as a sign of academic achievement
- **Regalia**- Clothing overdressings worn at Commencement. May include robes, caps, hoods, tassels, etc.
- **Stoles**- Fabric sashes draped over the shoulders worn to denote achievement or participation in an organization

IV. Responsibilities and Procedures

Academic Regalia

Bachelor's candidates

- Traditional navy blue gown.
- Caps are mortarboards; tassels are navy blue.

Master's candidates

- Traditional navy blue gown with full-length square sleeves with a crescent of cloth hanging from each sleeve.
- The master's hoods are lined in blue and white and colors appropriate to the program.

- Caps are traditional mortarboards with tassels appropriate to the program.

Doctoral candidates

- Black customized regalia with full rounded sleeves, velvet facing on the front, and velvet bars on the sleeves.
- Hoods are lined with blue and white and colors appropriate to the program.
- Doctoral candidates wear a tam.

Approved Cords and Stoles (University Purchased)

- The University will purchase cords for Bachelor’s candidates with the following academic honors. Cords are used to indicate academic honors and are not to be used for other purposes:
 - Academy: Blue and Gold Cord (UG)
 - Honors Program: Blue and White Cord (UG)
 - Latin Honors: Red, Silver, and Gold Cords (UG)
 - Kotzen Scholar: Stole (UG)
 - Boston Scholars: Stole (UG)

- Bachelor’s candidates may purchase a standard Simmons stole in white with the words “Simmons University” and Seal
- Candidates may purchase affinity and cultural stoles and cords approved below
 - Activity Duty or Veteran Stole
 - LatinX or Serape Cloth Stole
 - African-American or Kente Cloth Stole
 - Asian, Asian-American, Pacific Islander Stole
 - Indigenous Stole
 - First-Generation Stole
 - LGBTQIA+ Lavender Cord or Stole

University Funds

- Use of University funds to purchase stoles and cords for recognized or other student groups must have the written approval of the Student Engagement, Success, and Diversity / Provost’s Offices prior to the purchase.
